

Jeanne McDermott has been with the Fogarty International Center, NIH in the Division of International Research and Training as Program Officer since 2000. She is responsible for the research training programs related to HIV/AIDS, Her background is in nursing and midwifery (from Georgetown 1972 and 1979 respectively), and she has a MPH from Johns Hopkins (1983), and a Ph.D. in epidemiology from Emory (1996). She began her international career in Malawi where she taught nursing & midwifery and then served as the maternal health/family planning advisor in Swaziland.
